

Effective 12:01 AM, Tuesday, August 26, 2008, recreational fishing in Area 4 from the U.S./Canada Border to Cape Alava, Washington, and west of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line (Neah Bay subarea) remains closed, due to attainment of quota.

The State waters fishery east of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line (Area 4B) will remain open seven days per week to all salmon except Chinook; all coho must be marked with a healed adipose fin clip. See Washington state regulations for additional information.

Also, recreational fishing from Cape Alava to Queets River and Queets River to Leadbetter Point, Washington (La Push and Westport Subareas) will be open seven days per week through the end of the season. All other restrictions remain in effect.
